

Sponge or stone?

As daylight extends long into evening and temperatures rise, I find myself, even after 20 years in the Northern Hemisphere, confused. A part of me thinks it's December and the end of the year because of South African Summer memories. I'm often not sure where I am or what month it is. This "gentle" confusion or conflict keeps me second-guessing myself and alert. It's different from the conflict I sometimes experience before, during or after a retreat or Parish Mission. As regular as clockwork, some disruption occurs which attempts to derail or disturb me.

This happens so often, that I have come to expect or anticipate it, yet am always surprised at its subtlety — a sort of attack from the darkness. For example, on my way to the airport my car won't start, or my flight is canceled or delayed. I receive an upsetting email or phone message just before beginning a retreat, or the incorrect handouts are printed. Sometimes it's a misunderstanding in the midst of a retreat, or I receive some disturbing family news. The list is unending. Many of us experience the same dynamic in our lives.

St. Ignatius of Loyola has a lovely little parable — Water dripping into a sponge is quiet, silent and gentle. Water dripping on stone is discordant and harsh. Once I recognize this dark disruption there is relief and I'm usually able to return to center even if it takes time. I'm thrown and disturbed before the penny drops.

The art is in recognizing the

crafty, perfectly-timed attack, then recentering oneself. Is it darkness that we're experiencing, or merely the annoyances of typical, distracting events in everyday life?

Ignatius has another little teaching based on his personal experience — Some activities or thoughts are initially stimulating and enjoyable but then drop us into emptiness and negativity, while others don't have the addictive *high* but offer a long-lasting *Soul sweetness*. Awareness and discernment is the name of the game. Often disruption, distraction, confusion and conflict are red flags inviting pause. Is it "sponge or stone," Winter or Summer"? *Love.*
